Are you concerned about speeding in your road? If so you can help to make local roads safer by volunteering to assist the Town Council in Community Speed Watch. Train-ing is essential, and if you are interested in

being involved please contact us.

The objective of the scheme is to raise awareness of the dangers of speeding and anti social behaviour on the roads. Where appropriate the driver or registered keeper of offending vehicles will be sent a letter advising them of the dangers of speeding. The Town Council has purchased its own Speed Watch equipment to allow us to conduct these checks, however, we do need more volunteers. At present all speed watch sessions have been put on hold due to guidance received and will return when it is safe to do so.


